

We have to thank Jim Parks our treasurer and again, Judy Cooper and her student relations committee who next year will deal with 211 students at over 70 colleges and universities. Jim is retiring this year from being treasurer after several decades of service. I will really miss him.



This year your scholarship fund is helping educate 211 young engineering and architecture students throughout the nation.

In January 2017, Tom Lewis donated the 210th named scholarship in honor of his parents, The Richard and Shirley Lewis Scholarship, that will be awarded to an engineering student at the University of Connecticut. Tom is President of Louis Berger US, and a long-time supporter of the NYC Post.

In October 2017, Eric Hirani donated the 211th named scholarship, The Eric, Jiten (Jim), Sarita, Neil, and Alyssa Hirani Scholarship to be awarded to an engineering student in the FU School of Engineering at Columbia University. Eric is the President of Infinite Safety, Quality & Construction Management, Inc.

This scholarship fund was started by Joe Markle, a distinguished New York Construction Attorney. Joe died in 1989 when he was 89. Since that time the fund has awarded scholarships to 4,016 engineering and architecture students. Guest of Honor

Rear Admiral Melvin W. Bouboulis

Assistant Commandant for Engineering & Logistics, UNITED STATES COAST GUARD

Rear Admiral (Lower Half) Bouboulis currently serves as the Assistant Commandant for Engineering and Logistics (CG-4) as the Coast Guard's "Chief Engineer". In this role, he is responsible for all naval, aeronautical, civil and industrial engineering and logistics for the service's 23,000 facilities, 230 ships, 1,800 boats and



200 aircraft. He is also responsible for executing an annual budget of \$1 billion, and leads 5000 personnel assigned to Coast Guard Headquarters, Aviation Logistics Center, Surface Forces Logistics Center, Shore Infrastructure Logistics Center, and the CG Yard. He previously served as the USCG District Eight Chief of Staff, supporting U.S. Coast Guard operations spanning 26 states including the Gulf coastline from Florida to Mexico, the adjacent offshore waters of the Gulf of Mexico, and the inland waterways of the Mississippi, Ohio, Missouri, and Tennessee River.

Prior to that, Rear Admiral Bouboulis served as the Chief, Office of Aeronautical Engineering, responsible for all aeronautical engineering and aviation logistics for the Coast Guard's 200 operational aircraft, \$345 million annual budget, 1500 member workforce, and \$1.4 billion aviation materiel inventory. His previous assignments include: Commanding Officer, Coast Guard Air Station Boringuen, Puerto Rico, where he led 244 active duty, civilian and Auxiliary members providing aviation services for Coast Guard missions in the Eastern Caribbean; Logistics Department Head, Air Station Executive Officer and Commanding Officer of Enlisted Personnel for Sector/Air Station Corpus Christi, TX, responsible for all logistics support for 15 outlying units along 350 miles of the Texas coast from Mexico to Port O'Conner, TX; Aeronautical Engineer at the Aviation Training Center in Mobile, AL; Product Line Manager for the C-130 Hercules Combat Search and Research (CSAR) Military Transport Aircraft at Coast Guard Aviation Logistics Center, Elizabeth City, North Carolina; Assistant Engineering Officer, Coast Guard Air Station North Bend, Oregon; Communications and Law Enforcement Officer, Coast Guard Air Station New Orleans, Louisiana; Flight Training, Naval Air Station, Pensacola, FL; and Operations and Deck Watch Officer, USCGC CO-NIFIR, Long Beach, CA. Rear Admiral Bouboulis flew as an operational pilot at all of his aviation field assignments and participated in the historic Katrina response. He has qualified in the H-65 (A, B, and C models), HH-60J, and HC-130 aircraft accruing over 4,000 total flight hours.

Rear Admiral Bouboulis graduated from the Coast Guard Academy with a Bachelor of Science degree in Civil Engineering in 1987. He earned a Master in Science degree in Aeronautical Engineering from Purdue University in 2000, maintains DHS Acquisition Program Manager Level II certification, and holds Private, Commercial Airplane, Helicopter, and Airline Transport Pilot licenses.

Assistant Surgeon General and Chief Engineer U.S. Public Health Service National Center for Environmental Health Centers for Disease Control and Prevention and Agency for Toxic Substances and Disease Registry

RADM Edward M. Dieser became the 14th Chief Engineer Officer of the U.S. Public Health Service (PHS) on January 1, 2018. As the Chief Engineer, RADM Dieser advises the Department of Health and Human Services (HHS) on policy, resourcing, staffing, and leading professional affairs for engineers and architects working in



the HHS and serving in its Commissioned Corps. He will also be responsible for advising the Office of the Surgeon General on the recruitment, retention, training, readiness, deployment, and career management of the Corps.

He was also the Interim Commander and Executive Officer for Company C, 232nd Medical Battalion at Fort Sam Houston, TX. Lieutenant General Todd T. Semonite

54th Chief of Engineers and Commanding General U.S. Army Corps of Engineers

Lt. Gen. Todd T. Semonite assumed his position as Chief ofEngineers and Commanding General of the U.S. Army Corps of Engineers (USACE) on May 19, 2016. As the Chief of Engineers, an Army Staff Principal, he advises the Secretary of the Army and other Principal Officials on matters related to general,



combat and geospatial engineering; construction, real property, public infrastructure and natural resources science and management. As the USACE Commanding General, he is responsible for nearly 34,000 civilian employees and 750 military personnel who provide project management, construction support and science and engineering expertise in more than 110 countries. Prior to this assignment, Semonite established the Army Talent Management Task Force and served as its first director. In this role, he was responsible for reforming the way the Army acquires, develops, employs, and retains a talented workforce. Prior to those duties, Semonite was the commanding general for Combined Security Transition Command-Afghanistan, responsible for the building of the Afghan Army and Police through management of a \$13 billion budget to support a 352,000 individual force.

Semonite has previously served as the deputy chief of engineers and the deputy commanding general of the USACE, as well as commanding general of the USACE South Atlantic Division and North Atlantic Division. He also served as commanding general of the Maneuver Support Center, and as assistant commandant of the U.S. Army Engineer School. Other positions include: director, Office of the Chief of Engineers, Headquarters, Department of the Army; deputy commander, Task Force Restore Iraqi Electricity, and executive officer to the commanding general, U.S. Army Europe (USAEUR) and 7th Army. Semonite, a native of Bellows Falls, Vermont is a registered professional engineer in Vermont and Virginia. September 2017 - August 2018

2017 – 2018 was another good year for the Post... Since its formation on October 4th, 1920 the New York City Post has been chaired by outstanding leaders in both the military and civilian arms of the STEM professions. Attracting professionals at all levels, it continues as one of the few organizations in the country in which principals of major firms and military/ government executives have an opportunity, on a continuing basis, to network with one another and exchange important ideas and developments.

At its full schedule of meetings, the New York City Post has continually hosted nationally and internationally renowned guest speakers who have shared their expertise and interest in national defense and infrastructure resilience, the advancement of engineering knowledge, and the science of military engineering. These skills have positively influenced an audience beyond the military community, carrying over to a wide range of projects designed to serve our Nation's general population.

AN ACTIVE MEMBERSHIP FOCUS

Traditionally, the New York City Post has avidly pursued and encouraged professionals in engineering, architecture, and construction, to become active members of the organization. In recent years, the Post has continued to attempt to expand its membership to contractors, environmental professionals, lawyers, insurers, and marketing and media professionals who specialize in SAME-related activities. Our ongoing efforts to present technical topics of pertinence to today's engineers, as well as the availability of Continuing Education Credits at many Post and Post partner events make the Post even more relevant to those who wish to remain up to date in STEM.

THE GOLD STANDARD OF SAME SCHOLARSHIP FUNDS—THE NYC POST SAME SCHOLARSHIP FUND, INC.

To inspire students to pursue engineering careers and to begin an early association with SAME, the New York City Post sponsors an extraordinarily successful scholarship program (described in detail within this report). It also supports adjacent student SAME Posts by regularly informing them of activities, and encouraging their participation in Post activities. With a principal balance, at press time, of around \$3.2 Million, and Scholarships awarded across 35 states, there is no equal among the SAME Posts in scholarship funds.

COMPLIANCE WITH SAME FINANCIAL GUIDELINES

The New York City Post of SAME and its Scholarship Fund comply with all of SAME's national financial guidelines. Each year, the finances of both entities undergo appropriate audits to assure that sound financial practices are being pursued. Both the Operating Account and the separately incorporated NYC Post SAME Scholarship Fund are IRS recognized, 501(c)(3) charitable organizations.

Emergency Preparedness and Infrastructure Resilience Committee

Our greatest challenge – and opportunity – rests in the Emergency Preparedness and Infrastructure Resilience Committee as it strives to meet and exceed SAME National metrics and guidelines. The devastation of recent Hurricanes in Texas, Florida, the Southeast, and Puerto Rico continue to remind us of the need to spawn improvements in construction practices and infrastructure resilience – residential to commercial to industrial. Suzanne DiGeronimo chairs this Committee, continuing to support relevant efforts to not just recover, but improve resilience so as to prevent future damage.

Environmental Affairs and Advanced Engineering Technologies Committee

The Environmental Affairs Committee proved to be a highly active Committee, through its cooperation and cosponsorship of Green Building and Sustainability seminars, field trips, and other events in association with the USGBC, New Jersey Chapter. The DoD adoption of LEED standards in base construction provides our members who work with DoD with exposure to these standards through the Committee's activities, better enabling them to become partners with DoD in this ongoing and long term effort.
