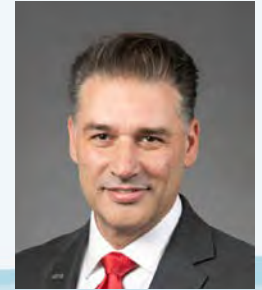



U.S. Coast Guard Guest of Honor



Vice Admiral Thomas G. Allan Jr.
Deputy Commandant for Mission Support

Vice Admiral Tom Allan assumed the duties as the Deputy Commandant for Mission Support in July 2024. As Deputy Commandant for Mission Support, Vice Admiral Allan leads the 17,000-person organization that delivers the people and systems that enable the U.S. Coast Guard to efficiently and effectively perform its operational missions; Vice Admiral Allan's responsibility extends to all facets of mission support including the oversight of the recruitment, development, and retention of human capital, the acquisition of complex surface, aviation, and C4IT systems, the overall lifecycle engineering and logistics required to maintain and support Coast Guard assets, information technology, and security.

Vice Admiral Allan most recently served as the Director of Operations – J3, United States Southern Command (U.S. SOUTHCOM) from June 2022 to June 2024 where he oversaw all operations, activities, and investments within U.S. SOUTHCOM's vast area of responsibility which encompasses 31 countries and 12 dependencies and areas of special sovereignty. Vice Admiral Allan's previous Flag assignments also include: Commander, First Coast Guard District, where he oversaw all Coast Guard missions across eight states in the Northeast, including over 2,000 miles of coastline from the U.S.-Canadian border to northern New Jersey and 1300 miles offshore; Assistant Commandant for Resources and Chief Financial Officer for the U.S. Coast Guard (CG-8) where he was responsible for all budgetary, financial and resource management activities relating to the programs and operations of the Coast Guard.

A native of Bowie, Maryland, Vice Admiral Allan earned a Bachelor of Science degree in Management from the U.S. Coast Guard academy. He later earned a Master of Business Administration from the University of Baltimore in Baltimore, Maryland and completed the Massachusetts Institute of Technology Seminar XXI.

Vice Admiral Allan's military awards include the Defense Superior Service Medal, the Coast Guard Legion of Merit, the Coast Guard Meritorious Service Medal, the Coast Guard Commendation Medal, and the Coast Guard Achievement Medal.

U.S. Army Corps of Engineers Honored Guest



Brigadier General John R. Pippy

**Acting Adjutant General,
Head of the Department of Military and Veterans Affairs**

◆ Brigadier General John R. Pippy assumed his duties as Pennsylvania's acting adjutant general and head of the Department of Military and Veterans Affairs (DMVA) on Sept. 30, 2024. In this cabinet-level position with the DMVA, headquartered at Fort Indiantown Gap, PA, Pippy oversees a combined state and federal budget of over \$900 million.

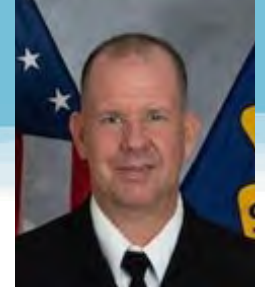
He is responsible for the command and control of nearly 18,000 Army and Air National Guard members (third largest National Guard); a complement of 2,500 commonwealth employees; care of residential cadets at the Keystone State ChalleNGe Academy; and six state-owned veterans homes and programs for Pennsylvania's more than 700,000 veterans (fourth largest in the nation).

Prior to assuming this position, Pippy most recently served as the director, Joint Staff, Joint Force Headquarters, Pennsylvania National Guard, and as the deputy chief of engineers for National Guard Affairs at the U.S. Army Corps of Engineer Headquarters in Washington, D.C. He also served in a variety of other command and staff positions within the Pennsylvania Army National Guard, which included two deployments to the Middle East. He deployed as the engineer director and headquarters battalion commander of Special Operations Joint Task Force Operation Inherent Resolve from September 2016 to July 2017, and in 2003 in support of Operation Iraqi Freedom as the commander of the 332nd EN CO (Kittanning, PA).

BG Pippy's awards and decorations include the Combat Action Badge, the Bronze Star Medal, the Defense Meritorious Service Medal, and the Army Engineer Regiment's Bronze Order of the De Fleury Medal.

BG Pippy also served in the Pennsylvania General Assembly for 16 years, retiring in 2012 from the Senate after serving nine years as a State Senator and seven years in the Pennsylvania House of Representatives.

U.S. Navy Honored Guest



Rear Admiral Dean VanderLey

**Commander, Naval Facilities Engineering Systems
Command and Chief of Civil Engineers**

◆ Rear Adm. Dean VanderLey is a native of Tacoma, Washington. After entering the Navy through the nuclear submarine training pipeline, VanderLey served on USS Michigan (SSBN 727), in various division officer positions from 1993-1996. He then served as the lead instructor for the Trident Prospective Commanding Officer course at Trident Training Facility, Bangor.

VanderLey was selected for transfer to the Civil Engineer Corps (CEC) in 1998. His initial CEC tours included assistant resident officer in charge of construction at Puget Sound Naval Shipyard; assistant public works officer, Naval Air Station Keflavik, Iceland; and operations officer for Naval Mobile Construction Battalion Seven.

His facilities and staff tours include planning officer, Navy Installations Command; executive assistant to the Principal Deputy Assistant Secretary of the Navy (Installations and Environment); public works officer, Naval Station Norfolk; Civil Engineer Corps head detailer; deputy commander for operations, Naval Facilities Engineering Command Atlantic; vice commander, Naval Facilities Engineering Command Atlantic.

VanderLey assumed the duties of Commander, Naval Facilities Engineering Systems Command, and became the 46th Chief of Civil Engineers on 12 August, 2022. He previously commanded Naval Facilities Engineering Systems Command Atlantic and held duties as fleet civil engineer, U.S. Fleet Forces Command; Naval Facilities Engineering Systems Command Mid-Atlantic; and Naval Mobile Construction Battalion Four. Most recently, he commanded Naval Facilities Engineering Systems Command Pacific and held duties as Fleet Civil Engineer and N46, U.S. Pacific Fleet.

His decorations include the Legion of Merit (four awards), Bronze Star, Meritorious Service Medal (six awards), Navy Commendation Medal (three awards), Navy Achievement Medal (four awards), Combat Action Ribbon, Presidential Unit Commendation Ribbon, and Iraq and Afghanistan Campaign Medals. VanderLey is a Submarine and Seabee Combat Warfare officer, Joint Qualified Officer, member of the Acquisition Professional Community, registered Professional Engineer, and a Certified Energy Manager. VanderLey is proud to have served with teams authorized to wear the Army and Navy Meritorious Unit Commendations, Navy "E" Ribbon, and in receipt of the Peltier Award.

U.S. Air Force Honored Guest



Colonel Michael Stefanovic
87th Civil Engineer Group Commander

◆ Colonel Michael Stefanovic is the 87th Civil Engineer Group Commander at the Department of Defense's on tri-service installation, Joint Base McGuire-Dix-Lakehurst. He is responsible for a 1,133-person member organization overseeing a \$14B physical plant in support of 89 diverse mission partners totaling 48,000 Joint military personnel and their families across 42,000 acres.

Colonel Stefanovic entered the Air Force in 2001 after obtaining his commission through the Reserve Officer Training Corps program at the Georgia Institute of Technology, earning a Bachelor of Science in mechanical engineering.

He served in various base level and headquarters assignments, including an international assignment as a counter-IED and explosive subject matter expert to the United Nations in New York. He deployed to Iraq and Afghanistan in support of overseas contingency operations as an Explosive Ordnance Disposal qualified Civil Engineer. Colonel Stefanovic recently served as the Director of the Chief of Staff of the Air Force Strategic Studies Group.

U.S. Public Health Service Honored Guest



Commander Ryan Clapp
Assistant Director,
Division of Sanitation Facilities Construction

◆ Commander Ryan Clapp is an Assistant Director with the Division of Sanitation Facilities Construction within the IHS Office of Environmental Health and Engineering. CDR Clapp is responsible for Division's Congressional reporting along with data analysis and metrics outputs.

CDR Clapp is an integral member of the Indian Health Service (IHS) Division of Sanitation Facilities Construction and has been supporting the IHS in the implementation of the \$3.5 B in funding IHS received via the Infrastructure Investment and Job Act to improve water access and waste disposal services in American Indian and Alaska Native Tribes and Communities. CDR Clapp was also the first officer to deploy to the Navajo Nation at the beginning of the COVID-19 pandemic in support of the agency's efforts to immediately increase access to water hauling points benefiting Navajo Nation residents living in home without access to piped water.

He is a licensed professional engineer in the states of Maine and New Mexico. CDR Clapp is an alumni of the University of Maine and the University of Florida.

Public Entities of the Year

NYC DEPARTMENT OF DESIGN AND CONSTRUCTION

The NYC Department of Design and Construction is one of the agencies leading the City's responses to climate change and the risk of coastal flooding. Projects include the East Side Coastal Resiliency (ESCR) project and Brooklyn Bridge-Montgomery Coastal Resiliency (BMCR), both in Manhattan. ESCR is a \$1.45 billion project that will provide flood protection and improve open spaces for more than 110,000 New Yorkers, including 28,000 residents in NYCHA housing. BMCR will install a combination of flood walls and deployable flip-up barriers to protect the Two Bridges neighborhood, while also maintaining waterfront access. DDC is also at work on a resiliency project to protect Red Hook, Brooklyn.



NYC DEPARTMENT OF ENVIRONMENTAL PROTECTION

The NYC Department of Environmental Protection (DEP) is dedicated to keeping residents safe from increasingly intense coastal storms and improving the quality of life in waterfront neighborhoods. To achieve this mission, DEP established the Bureau of Coastal Resiliency, a new Bureau tasked with coordinating resiliency efforts for NYC's 520 miles of coastline. Through the Bureau of Coastal Resiliency, DEP is now leading the planning, implementation, and operation of the city's coastal resiliency infrastructure. DEP's and BCR's leadership allows for streamlined decision making and faster project delivery, ensuring that New York City is prepared to protect its residents and critical infrastructure during future storms.



NYC ECONOMIC DEVELOPMENT CORPORATION

The NYC Economic Development Corporation (NYCEDC) is a mission-driven, nonprofit organization that works for a vibrant, inclusive and globally competitive economy for all New Yorkers.



We take a comprehensive approach, through four main strategies: strengthen confidence in NYC as a great place to do business; grow innovative sectors with a focus on equity; build neighborhoods as places to live, learn, work and play; and deliver sustainable infrastructure for communities and the city's future economy. In partnership with our City partners, EDC has taken a leadership role in planning, designing and building sustainable coastal resiliency projects across the five boroughs. The city is realizing increased protection through EDC-led projects such as Lower Manhattan Coastal Resiliency portfolio, Raise Shorelines, Rockaway Boardwalk, and Coney Island Creek Coastal Resiliency projects.

BATTERY PARK CITY AUTHORITY

The Battery Park City Authority is a New York State Public Benefit Corporation that owns and maintains Battery Park City, a 92-acre site at the southern tip of Manhattan which is home to a vibrant mixed-use community and 36 acres of parks and open spaces. Its waterfront location makes Battery Park City particularly vulnerable to the risks posed by coastal storm surge and sea level rise, as was plainly evidenced by the damage left in the wake of Superstorm Sandy in 2012. Over the years, the Authority has undertaken an ambitious program of coastal resiliency projects, including the BPC Ballfield Resiliency Project (completed in 2022), the South BPC Resiliency Project (scheduled for completion in 2025), and the North/West BPC Resiliency Project (scheduled to commence construction in 2025). When completed, the South BPC Resiliency Project and the North/West BPC Resiliency Project will collectively constitute a flood barrier system of nearly 2 miles in length – representing a significant segment of NYC's Lower Manhattan Coastal Resiliency Program – and provide flood risk reduction for scores of residential, commercial and public buildings; approximately 30,000 residents; over 60,000 jobs; and extensive public infrastructure and parks located in Lower Manhattan.

KSE as joint venture partner with AKRF was responsible for preliminary and final design of the largest flood mitigation and resiliency project in lower Manhattan. The firm specifically performed structural engineering, including the design of overhead and cantilevered sign structures over the FDR, design of a new bridge across the FDR, retaining walls, foundations for a sewer interceptor gate building, canopies, and tennis and track houses within the East River Park. Additionally, KSE performed engineering for Maintenance of Traffic, extensive geotechnical engineering supports, and supplemental surveying. Notably, the new Corlears Hook Bridge is a Steel Tied Arch Suspended Bridge, with a span of 158 feet over the FDR Drive. Designed for heavy emergency vehicles, the bridge connects Corlears Park on the Manhattan side and the Corlears Hook Amphitheater located in East River Park. For the past 33 years KSE has been a trusted partner with all major NYC public agencies doing its part to reshape our city for the next generation.

SCAPE worked on the city's Coastal Protection plan in the aftermath of superstorm Sandy, won the Rebuild by Design competition, and have implemented nature-based infrastructure projects across the region, SCAPE is a women owned business and a leader in the field. Widely considered a model for climate-adaptive nature-based infrastructure, SCAPE's \$107 million Living Breakwaters project advances a layered approach to risk reduction—enhancing physical, ecological and social resilience on Staten Island. These partially submerged structures built of stone and ecologically-enhanced concrete units break waves, reduce beach erosion, and provide a range of habitat spaces for oysters, fin fish and other marine species.

Year in Review

SEPTEMBER 2023 – AUGUST 2024

This year found the Post having to adjust to the “new normal” in a post-COVID world. Economic necessity forced us to abandon our longtime meeting location of the Harvard Club. Instead, with so many people working remotely or in a hybrid circumstance, we adjusted our main meetings to coincide with exciting Post events, such as the Resiliency Summit and the West Point Cadet Engineer Dinner.

That trend continues to challenge our committees to find more creative ways to garner support for those events that are designed to support our renowned NYC Post SAME Scholarship Fund.

YOUNG MEMBERS COMMITTEE

Since its inception in 1988, the Young Member Committee (YMC) has undertaken a variety of activities, including professional development seminars, technical presentations, fund raising, and participation in regional and national SAME conferences. This year, the YMC again stepped up to do a great job in managing the Post’s involvement in the Cadet Engineering Dinner at West Point. Vincent Antes, of WSP, again served as Chair of the Young Member Committee.

The venerable New York City Post of the Society of American Military Engineers, along with the National Society, celebrates 104 Years in 2024! The Post advances SAME’s objectives by uniting architecture, engineering, construction (A/E/C), facility management and environmental entities and individuals in the public and private sectors to prepare for—and overcome—natural and manmade disasters, and to improve security at home and abroad. STRENGTH AND LEADERSHIP AND NETWORKING OPPORTUNITIES

Since its formation on October 4th, 1920 the New York City Post has been chaired by outstanding leaders in both the military and civilian arms of the STEM professions. Attracting professionals at all levels, it continues as one of the few organizations in the country in which principals of major firms and military/ government executives have an opportunity, on a continuing basis, to network with one another and exchange important ideas and developments.

At its full schedule of meetings and events, the New York City Post has continually hosted nationally and internationally renowned guest speakers who have shared their expertise and interest in national defense and infrastructure resilience, the advancement of engineering knowledge, and the science of military engineering. These skills have positively influenced an audience beyond the military

community, carrying over to a wide range of projects designed to serve our Nation’s general population.

AN ACTIVE MEMBERSHIP FOCUS

Traditionally, the New York City Post has avidly pursued and encouraged professionals in engineering, architecture, and construction, to become active members of the organization. In recent years, the Post has continued to attempt to expand its membership to contractors, environmental professionals, lawyers, insurers, and marketing and media professionals who specialize in SAME-related activities. Our ongoing efforts to present technical topics of pertinence to today’s engineers, as well as the availability of Continuing Education Credits at many Post and Post partner events, to those who attend, make the Post even more relevant to those who wish to remain up to date in STEM.

THE GOLD STANDARD OF S.A.M.E. SCHOLARSHIP FUNDS – THE NYC POST S.A.M.E. SCHOLARSHIP FUND, INC.

To inspire students to pursue engineering careers and to begin an early association with SAME, the New York City Post sponsors an extraordinarily successful scholarship program (described in detail within this report). It also supports adjacent student SAME Posts by regularly informing them of activities and encouraging their participation in Post activities. With a principal balance, at press time, of around \$3.0 Million, and Scholarships awarded across the U.S., there is no equal among the SAME Posts in scholarship funds.

COMPLIANCE WITH S.A.M.E. FINANCIAL GUIDELINES

The New York City Post of SAME and its Scholarship Fund comply with all of SAME’s national financial guidelines. Each year, the finances of both entities undergo appropriate audits to assure that sound financial practices are being pursued. Both the Operating Account and the separately incorporated NYC Post SAME Scholarship Fund are independently recognized by the IRS as 501(c)(3) charitable organizations.

EMERGENCY PREPAREDNESS AND INFRASTRUCTURE RESILIENCE COMMITTEE

Our greatest challenge – and opportunity – rests in the Emergency Preparedness and Infrastructure Resilience Committee as it strives to meet and exceed SAME National metrics and guidelines. The continued devastation of recent Hurricanes reminds us of the need for/ spawn improvements in construction practices and infrastructure resilience in all sectors – residential to commercial to industrial. Suzanne DiGeronimo continues as chair of this Committee, continuing to support relevant efforts to not just recover, but improve resilience so as to prevent future damages. 2024 again featured a series of “Lunch and Learns” to further the goal of educating our wide audience on this most important topic. The events were spearheaded by both Suzanne’s Committee and our Environmental Affairs and Advanced Engineering Technologies Committee (see below) along with our USGBC partner.

ENVIRONMENTAL AFFAIRS AND ADVANCED ENGINEERING TECHNOLOGIES COMMITTEE

The Environmental Affairs Committee again proved to be a highly active Committee, through its cooperation and co-sponsorship of Green Building and Sustainability seminars, field trips, and other events in association with the USGBC North Atlantic/ New England Region. The DoD adoption of LEED standards in base construction provides our members who work with DoD with exposure to these standards through the Committee’s activities, better enabling them to become partners with DoD in this ongoing and long-term effort. 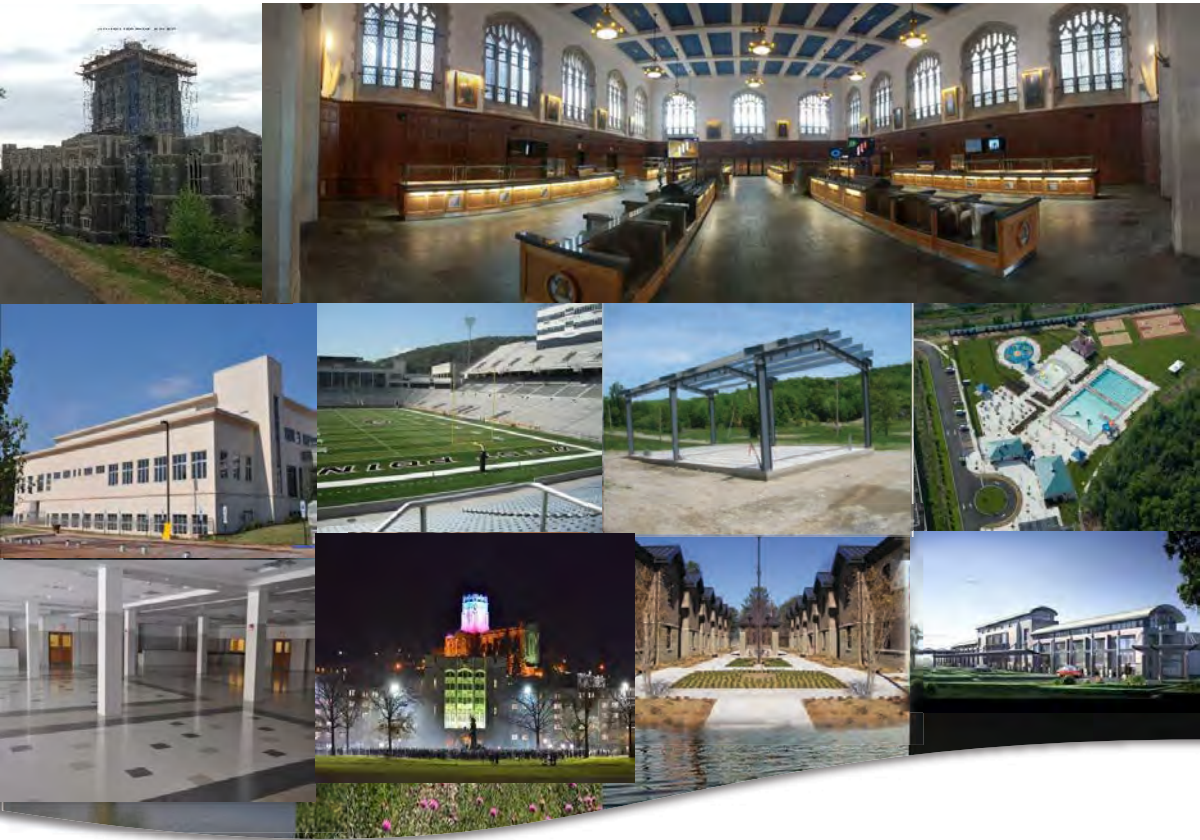
